Final Statement of Reasons

Subject Matter of Proposed Regulations: Appeal Process for Contested Citations and Licensee Compliance with Assessed Fines

Sections Affected: Amend sections 390.4 and 390.5 of Article 9 of Division 4 of Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations

Updated Information

The Informative Digest and Initial Statement of Reasons (ISOR) are included in the rulemaking file and incorporated as though set forth herein.

The Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board) noticed the proposed rulemaking on May 2, 2025, with a 45-day comment period ending on June 16, 2025. No public hearing was originally set for this proposal, and no public hearing was requested. No comments were received.

The Board updated the text post-notice to correct the “authority” and “reference” citations to the Chiropractic Initiative Act of California in the Note section. These changes are non-substantive because they do not materially alter any requirement, right, responsibility, condition, prescription, or other regulatory element of any California Code of Regulations provision and they provide a more accurate citation to the “authority” and “reference” for this proposal.

Local Mandate

A mandate is not imposed on local agencies or school districts.

Consideration of Alternatives

No reasonable alternative which was considered or that has otherwise been identified and brought to the attention of the Board would be more effective in carrying out the purpose for which it was proposed or would be as effective and less burdensome to affected private persons than the adopted regulations or would be more cost effective to affected private persons and equally effective in implementing the statutory policy or other provision of law. The Board incorporates by reference the alternatives identified in its ISOR and did not receive any comments that altered its findings.

Comments

The 45-day comment period began on May 2, 2025, and ended on June 16, 2025. The Board did not hold a hearing.

The Board received no comments during the notice period.
